# THE 2014 SEASON

Having been deprived of the officially elected captain in 2013 because of an early season injury, Southgate began a new season firing on all cylinders with Faisal Mir now back in full time charge. What his honest aspirations were as the season commenced can only be gleaned from his report later in this publication (see pages 16-19) but certainly the astonishing (maybe to more than a few) climax which culminated in promotion to the premier division for 2015 was an unexpected outcome at such an early stage of redevelopment. The team deserves hearty congratulations on a magnificent effort.

The acquisition of Sri Lankan Under 19s captain Kusal Mendis was an exciting prospect, arriving as he did with a lot of pedigree and promise. Conditions were not so familiar to the young batsman and it was difficult for him to make a mark when it would have really counted but we did get glimpses of his class. Instances such as his 171 in the chase against Hertford to retain the annual Hertgate Trophy and his unbeaten 118 to secure the Under 21 Development League Shield in the Final against Indian Gymkhana showed his exceptional striking power for one of such diminutive stature. Against a shell-shocked 1987 League Representative XI Kusal was dismissed for 81 out of 104 in only the 9<sup>th</sup> over of the innings, having hit thirteen fours and two sixes.

It was good to welcome Michael Stevens back after a ten year break and his contributions with bat and ball were invaluable. The fact that nobody stood out but that three batsmen exceeded 300 runs (with hero Jamie Jouning bubbling under) none of whom averaged 30 and that four bowlers shared 108 wickets at an average of 16.39 showed that it was much more of a team effort than usually apparent in this type of competition. An unsung hero in all this is David Gakhar, managing director of our sponsor Underpin & Makegood who, with Jeremy Dangerfield's active encouragement, half financed and fully delivered two mobile cage nets at the beginning of the summer. Thus morally uplifted, the club weekly practice continued throughout the entire summer without the habitual tailing off by the end of June. The second net was generously funded by former president Martin Fletcher to whom the club is especially grateful.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> XI again contrived to disappoint, finishing 5<sup>th</sup> in the 3<sup>rd</sup> division, but not through any lack of inspiration on the part of incoming captain Sam Faruqi. The side maintained a positive outlook and clearly enjoyed their cricket but considering the regular availability of the thriving first team, the balance of the team was not as drastically affected as in previous years. Nevertheless, some very sound performances found themselves punctuated by some disappointingly inept displays. Matt Stratten finally came into his own with 382 runs, supported by the ever-reliable Max Joseph (377), while Ravi Desai enhanced his 2013 3<sup>rd</sup> XI reputation with 35 wickets and Omair Ali played a valuable new ball role taking 29.

Wins against North London (twice), Bessborough (twice), Wembley and Kenton were insufficient reward for a talented side. Rain prevented a likely win at home to Wycombe House with Jouning and Stratten at the wicket, Brentham hung on at 80-9 following our 216-9, and a mid-order collapse from 199-3 to 216 all out chasing Enfield's declaration at 222 was little short of disastrous. The effect was that Enfield came second in the table when a Southgate win plus 4 points anywhere else would have meant Southgate would have been second instead. Omair Ali and Ravi Desai, as the most numerically successful bowlers were nevertheless well supported by Sam Wadham, who produced two remarkable sustained spells of bowling in particular, Abdul Quiyum and Sam Faruqi.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> XI finished 4<sup>th</sup> in the 1987 League Division One, nine points adrift of 2<sup>nd</sup> place. Adrian Carr (33 wickets), Roy Marett (30) and skipper Mike Carter (30) proved difficult to score off and runs came in quantity from time to time, especially if Jeremy Dangerfield could be enticed to play. Ankit Patel was the find of the season with 301 runs but more especially 12 (sometimes blinding) catches.

No wins in the first five matches meant there was a lot of work to do. A position of 42-5 at home to Enfield had been reversed by a stand of 135, just two short of a Southgate League record for the 6<sup>th</sup> wicket to set up a declaration, but finding themselves at 40-4 from 15 overs, Enfield declined the challenge and dropped anchor. Such is the way with league cricket. Edmonton hung on nine down, and we lost at Alexandra Park by one wicket with two balls remaining – but a great game. The damage was in part repaired by four wins on the trot over South Hampstead, Old Actonians, Bessborough and Indian Gymkhana and by mid-July the 3s had actually only lost the one game and were six points clear at the top of the league. However, a one-point draw and two defeats checked our drive and although we picked up two easy wins again Edmonton and AP and closed off with a win over Bessborough and a tie at Indian Gymkhana, we were by-passed by the three sides we hadn't manage to beat.

The 4<sup>th</sup> XI confirmed all the suspicions that a side could be satisfactorily raised with reserves to spare if anyone could take the trouble, and enjoyed greater than expected success, finishing 7<sup>th</sup> in the reconstituted Division 5. A fuller report appears later in this Review on pages 26-27.

A disappointment of the season, and a reflection of the prevailing decline of interest in the game, has been the disinclination of players to play on a Sunday. Outside the handful of Middlesex Development Under 21 matches, the diminishing number of planned friendly fixtures were all cancelled through insufficient availability with the exception of the August Bank Holiday Old Citizens game which was ironically rained off.

Jamie Jouning achieved the distinction of overhauling Finchley's Mike Milton's 1<sup>st</sup> XI League record by breaking the 8,000 run barrier, a feat duly recognised at the MCCL Dinner in October. Congratulations to Alvin Durgacharan on passing the 5,000 mark at the same level, Faisal Mir 200 wickets and David Woffinden 100 wickets, the latter having now taken 111 at a remarkable 15.62 considering the luxury of today's covered wickets. Updated career records appear at the end of this Review which may serve a variety of purposes but hopefully, for present players at least, motivation to seek enhanced landmarks on the field of play.

Good luck to everybody next season. With the youngsters maturing by the day we have talent at all levels of the club and the dads are eager to play their part too. Long may it last.

## 1st XI Report

The 2014 season for Southgate's 1st XI was very much a vintage one which shall long remain in the memories of all who were playing and watching at Harrow CC on that final day of the season. With premiership promotion up for grabs for five different teams going into the last day, all sorts of outcomes were possible.

We lay in fourth place on seventy five points with both Shepherds Bush and Brentham ahead of us by just two points on seventy seven tied and ten points adrift of league leaders Indian Gymkhana who should have wrapped up the league by now having been top all year, but started to get the jitters at the back end ever since they lost to us. It meant we needed to win and then were relying on a couple of results to go our way.

The game at Harrow culminated in a nail-biting and quite remarkable climax in itself with us just getting over the line in a superbly timed run chase, let alone the other results which we managed to receive during and after the game. Joyous scenes and great jubilation occurred as we heard news that both Brentham and the Bush had lost which saw us gain promotion in dramatic fashion.

A truly memorable day for Southgate Cricket Club getting back in the Premier Division and one that shall be remembered for many a year to come. As mentioned in my last year's report, I felt the transition and rebuilding period in 2013 had been successful and the plan of getting into the premiership in the next year or two was the next target.

To have secured premiership status within a year has been a proud achievement and with the team's foundations underpinned by youth, the future of the club certainly bodes well for years to come.

#### And so to the season ...

With a good pre-season behind us, our first league game kicked off with a visit to Harrow St Mary's who had turned us over twice last year. It was going to be a good test to see where we were as a side and, having won the toss, we started off in real good fashion having them on the ropes for 50-5 only for the weather to intervene which meant no more play for the day. One point each and fair to say they were the happier of the two teams.

A home encounter against the returning Enfield who had been promoted from Division 3 saw us gain yet another single point. After a good early bowling display we let ourselves down with the bat but unlike in previous years we did not capitulate having been 80-6. A good rearguard showed there was a bit of steel in the side and we were not going to hand them all ten points.

The following week was a washout against Brentham which meant going into our fourth league game we only had registered three points. Safe to say not the start we had wanted with Winchmore Hill as our next opponents but spirit in the camp was high. Having been inserted on a damp one we managed to get rolled out for 81 (not the first time against the Hill) and we were well and truly staring down the barrel at tea.

However, due to some over confidence by the senior Hill batsmen who thought they were going to stroll it (30-1 at one stage) and some really tight bowling which resulted in a flurry of wickets, the dimensions of the game had changed. The tables had switched and the air of confidence from the Hill batsman had disappeared with doubt replacing it. The team could sniff a bit of blood and

that's all we needed to run (well hop, skip and jump) through them and the rest is history, all out for 74 and cue amazing scenes at the Walker.

This result against a side who had dominated us throughout the last 10 years I believe gave the team a real sense of self-belief going forward that we could beat anyone; more importantly we had registered our first 10 points.

The most bizarre game of the year took place at eventual Division 2 winners Indian Gymkhana the following week. It what can only be described as a pitch resembling day 6 at Galle we managed to skittle the oppo out for 130 in 40 overs with again a fine bowling display. So 60 overs to get 130: simple - "bat the overs we win the game" was the chat in the dressing room. With plenty of gamesmanship in play and two left-arm spinners taking the old ball on a raging bunsen all was not quite what it seemed. After an epic effort we fell agonisingly short of the total by one run on 129 with 9 wickets down after 60 overs in what was an enthralling encounter and, truth be told, we were gutted at not getting over the line. However, the players, although disappointed at the time, added another layer of steel to the team as we didn't hand the oppo all ten points. To bat for 60 overs on that pitch was a hell of an effort and will certainly hold us in good stead for life in the premiership.

Week 5 saw us defeated for the first time in the season against Uxbridge who would be in the mix at the top of the table throughout the whole season. Again, a really good effort by the bowlers restricting them to 184 of 55 overs but a lacklustre effort with the bat saw us get blown away for 96. An honest and healthy chat by the players in the changing room at Uxbridge took place after the game and it was a good sign as it showed we were all in it together and not shirking the issue.

Week 6 saw us come against a strong Shepherds Bush side who outplayed us in all departments inflicting our second defeat on the trot. It was a good sign to see the batting click for the first time in the season only for an even better batting display by the oppo.

So going into week 7 at Eastcote we had only accumulated fourteen points and were at the wrong end of the table but the feeling within the camp was strong and it was only a matter of time before we clicked. Training sessions had be very productive but we had to do it on the pitch and quickly.

The game at Eastcote was another last over thriller with the weather being heavily involved not just with our game but throughout the whole league. We were the only side in the division (actually entire Middlesex League in fact) to pick up a win that week which helped us to get up that table, a real shot in the arm.

I believe this was the turning point for us as a unit in the season as we would go on to win our next two games on the bounce in clinical fashion (Harrow, chased down 219 at the Walker and the turnaround fixture with Harrow St Mary's at home also who we blew away 105 ao), the team on a real high, playing some good cricket and gathering momentum.

The return fixture at Enfield who were proving to hold their own in the division saw us drop back down to reality as we just didn't turn up on the day and were quite comfortably beaten. This was followed up by another poor batting effort against Brentham which resulted in another loss.

Two defeats in two again and back to the drawing board.

Our saving grace at this point of the season was that everyone was beating each other and there was no one really pulling away which kept the table tightly compressed and a glimmer of a chance stood provided we could string a few results together to see us at the business end come the end of the campaign.

The team knew what needed to be done as there was still hope and belief amongst the ranks, and so this proved as we won our next three games on the bounce, playing arguably our best cricket of the season. The first came with a demolition job at Winchmore Hill, followed by another thriller at home against high-flying Indian Gymkhana who had been top of the table for most of the year. Uxbridge were dismantled in sensational fashion (55 ao) and this victory meant for the first time

in the season we were in second place, ten points behind the leaders Indian Gymkhana with Shepherds Bush in third one point behind us.

Our next game would see us in a crunch game against Shepherds Bush with everything to play for. With only one point separating us it would turn out to be a cagey affair and although we played some very good cricket in parts they also played a hand and proved why we were both at the top end of the table. A rain break in our run chase scuppered us somewhat, followed by a flurry of wickets which meant we had to bat out for a losing draw with only two wickets remaining.

So our penultimate game would see us play Eastcote who had hit a purple patch and had just beaten the league leaders Indian Gym in what was a must-win match. With the Bush overtaking us by two points we needed to beat Eastcote in order to take it into the final day and try to keep our destiny in our own hands. However, this was not meant to be as a resurgent Eastcote (who had won their last five after losing their previous eight) gained revenge on us from our first encounter after a poor batting display from us (113 ao).

The scenes in the dressing room after were very gloomy and our chance of taking it into the final day had slipped out of our hands. However, then news had drifted in that both 2nd and 1st place had lost and we were going into the final week in fourth with a small chance of promotion.

From a state of utter depression and misery a tiny bit of hope spread throughout the dressing room: all to play for, lads!

Placed in fourth on seventy five points with both Brentham and the Bush tied on seventy seven points and Indian Gym on eighty five, it was a case of taking care of our game and hoping for the best knowing if it wasn't meant to be we knew where we had come short but now wasn't the time to have those thoughts.

The final game at Harrow strangely enough saw us go in with an air of confidence. Training that week had been really good and the team knew that only a win would do and the rest we would have to leave in the hands of the cricketing gods. In what turned out to be a cracking finale to the season the team put in an outstanding performance with the ball bowling Harrow out for 176 in 46 overs after a somewhat shaky start. It meant we had 54 overs to get them in and it was in the 54th and final over that we did eventually get them after a roller coaster of events.

To say the match lay on a knife edge during our run chase is a bit of an understatement, all the team huddled together cheering every run, cursing every fallen wicket. Some standing, some sitting, some refusing to watch while others were fixated to their phones to check on twitter for results. To finally hear the news of other results going our way after we had celebrated a fantastic run chase and then realised we had gained promotion was truly a sweet moment for everyone.

We may have not been at the top of the table throughout the year, but the fact that we were only second once throughout the campaign and eventually finished as runners up ten points behind Indian Gym showed that we never gave up. We kept on the heels of our opponents and kept chipping away. When we were good we were really good and most teams throughout the league would acknowledge this but we did have our bad moments like you do but we kept fighting and scrapping, believing things would happen.

This is something which hasn't appeared suddenly in this squad - it has been building throughout the last two seasons through close bonds and friendships amongst the players on and off the field. The art of winning as well as not losing games is something which this team now possesses and is a great quality.

Yes, individuals stepped up when they needed to through certain games: that is expected but the efforts and the contribution of the team as a whole far outweighed individual brilliance. The players acknowledged when someone had stepped up and they enjoyed each other's success knowing the bigger picture was the team's success.

Despite this success, now is not the time to rest on our laurels. More improvement is required from this team and the bigger picture of holding our own and competing in the top league now presents itself.

I'd just like to take this opportunity to thank all who have been involved with the success of the 1st XI in the 2014 season, from the supporters who come and watch us each week, the committee, our scorer Andrew Parkin who despite ill health continued scoring, the teas from Sue, the ground staff as well as the bar staff. Without these people our lives would be that little bit harder and we hope you continue to support the club.

Lastly I'd just like to say a big thank you to all the players that have been involved in the team this year: it genuinely has been an entire team effort to get to where we are now. Yes, I can name individuals who have had brilliant moments but we know who they are; overall the stats will show wickets were shared as well as the runs.

And so to the excitement of the new 2015 season: plenty of planning and hard work now lies ahead. Behind the scenes the recruitment drive has been ongoing in the hope the right individuals can be sought. The key will be to try and get proven quality in to add to the young exciting squad that we already possess. Let's not leave any stone unturned, individually and as a club. We are here now and we must ensure we stay in the league and look to grow. This starts by planning and preparing for the season now.

The tragedy of the previous season was that the absence of a Team Secretary meant that there was no one to draw together a side of players who either hadn't replied to the call for availability or were not, in fact, in regular contact with the club. As I had suspected all along, these players were all lurking in the sidelines waiting to be called up: Julius Thomson (the reclamation of the season!), Abdullah Munawar, Peter McLoughlin and David Lowen plus "guest" appearances from the likes of former regulars Ron Hewit and Akshay Jain. Groundsman Jack Stapleton did us proud as a self-confessed non-cricketer, courageously intercepting firm drives at mid-on and taking valuable catches for both the 4<sup>th</sup> and the 3<sup>rd</sup> XI.

Winter moments had been spent dreaming up the perfect side. Gordon and Gunn seemed to be regular fixtures. Shaffick and Liam Babwah were definites as were Graham and Tom Clark plus the bonus of Tom's granddad John Stone. At this rate we could actually be in a selection situation which to a certain degree became true because Delmore Walters was incommunicable and in any event failed to arrive on three occasions when a game was available for him. In the event, the nominated captain played half his season's games with the 3s because of the sheer scarcity of wicketkeepers so Doug Gordon adapted to his erstwhile forsaken role with good spirit and displayed the exemplary patience with his fielding side as he does while at the wicket.

The season started in an unusual fashion at home to West Harrow when, after a badly rain affected day 9-man West Harrow concluded their innings on 83. With our batting line-up (!) we were keen to chase but rain had got under the covers and only one end was safe enough to bowl from. So the option was put to us to bowl from that end all innings, and though the weather did not really deteriorate from its already poor state and with our score at 55-0, the West Harrow skipper and his men were so cold, wet and miserable and Southgate "were going to win anyway" that they announced they were conceding the game and walked off. Discussions as to how legal this actually was were never really established but as long as the full details surrounding the result didn't reach the league, everybody seemed happy. Not least us – a 10 point bonus start!

It was inevitably not just plain sailing after that but good games were played in a terrific spirit. Graham Clark consistently rallied the troops with encouraging shouts from the covers where he and Tom took some superb catches. Julius was a jewel while we could conceal him in the side, batting, bowling and the safest pair of hands imaginable. We were similarly never likely to retain the services of Ankit Patel and they both adorned the 3s for the rest of the season. Shaffick bowled uncomplainingly as we came to rely on his slow left-arm and his 6-40 against a powerful Bessborough side brought an incredible victory. Dave Wakefield, guesting for us from Eastcote, gave us a new ball exponent for seven matches and he too claimed 6-52 away to West Harrow where we conceded 33 extras in their 96 all out in reply to our 137 (only 27 extras). The third father and son combo came from the McLoughlins. With a couple of fifties and a 40, father Peter reminded us what a good batsman (and catcher) he is. Having played for Southgate as a young man in 1991 and with a previous club top score of 70, he would be a valuable regular asset, especially if son Christian is available to inherit a batting and 'keeping slot from the aging incumbent. Christian also put some useful innings together and could hit the ball powerfully.

## **Southgate Colts**

The experiment of hiring additional external coaching staff helped reduce the pressure on the club's own limited resources. There were 80 colts on the books from ages 7 to 15. The Under 11 and Under 13 teams did not enjoy a particularly memorable season but both maintained their Middlesex East Division One status for the coming season, as did the Under 15s who performed strongly and have the potential to enjoy a better than usual campaign in 2015.

A highly enjoyable Colts vs Parents game was followed by a magnificent curry evening organised by Amit and Shruti Patel coupled with extensive support from a number of dedicated parents and raised £420 for the club. 63 colts, parents and coaches attended a very successful annual colts' Awards Supper in November.

#### **Middlesex East Area Colts competitions**

#### Under 15s

Captained by James Dangerfield, the Under 15 side finished third in Division One of the Middlesex East Area competition and qualified for the play-offs. A final highlight to the season was beating Edmonton's monumental score of 123-8 in their 20 overs to win by nine wickets.

Liam Babwah was only available for four of the nine games, scoring 76 runs at 25.33, and taking 2 wickets for 27 runs. James and Henry played in all nine games and Christian in eight. James captained the successful Enfield Borough U14 side in which Henry and Devin Dhanki also played and they were all selected to represent the regional U14s in the Middlesex Festival. Henry's match-winning 5-35 for the Under 21 Development XI against North London in the semi-final of the Shield competition was an outstanding performance for a 14-year-old and he also bowled effectively in Saturday adult fixtures for the 4<sup>th</sup> and then 3<sup>rd</sup> XIs. James continues to progress although he would have been pleased with more runs even though his off-spin was of special value to the adult club 3<sup>rd</sup> XI at the expense of batting opportunities. Christian McLoughlin translated his batting and wicketkeeping abilities quite successfully into the adult 4<sup>th</sup> XI. Liam Babwah also made an effective transition into the adult game and took some memorable high catches.

#### Under 13s

The side did just enough to retain its place in Division One although competition is certainly getting tougher. The batting largely failed to deliver or, when it did, somewhat spasmodically. Nevertheless, Devin Dhanki led by example and was the leading batsman (183 runs at 22.88 with a top score of 58 not out against Cockfosters) and took 12 wickets (14.33). Tom Stanton (92 runs and 7 wickets) suffered a streak of batting failures punctuated by two powerful and productive innings, notably 47 not out against Old Elizabethans. He has all the potential of a

consistent match winner but needs to wait for the right ball to hit. Similarly, concentration in his bowling would bring far greater dividends. The same could be said for Shanuk Wickramaratna (107 runs and 10 wickets) who finally found form with three good innings towards the end of the campaign. Tom Parsons bowled consistently tidily for his 9 wickets and Shrey Parmar showed useful all-round potential as the season progressed. Ollie Gakhar perhaps lacked a little luck but his 3-7 in 4 overs against Potters Bar and 3-15 against Holtwhites showed signs that his left-arm seam can pose a threat to batsmen. Harshil Vipani found himself parachuted into the wicketkeeping role and what he lacked in technique he made up for with enthusiasm, and enjoyed a couple of productive innings too.

#### **Under 11s**

The newly promoted team held on to their place in the top division by the skin of their teeth. William McLoughlin batted consistently well for 133 runs at an average of 26.60, the highlight being a glorious unbeaten 60 at Winchmore Hill. Gautam Datta was the leading bowler with 12 wickets at a parsimonious average of 6.33. Alex Stanton (53 runs, average 17.66 and 6 wickets) and Charlie Bates with five double-figure scores in six innings and an average of 21.33 made useful contributions. George Hooper-Greenhill bowled thoughtfully and accurately for his 9 wickets at 7.33 and was well supported by Andrew Rosen with six wickets at 15.33. The team also held some very good catches, in particular by Harry Showell, George Hooper-Greenhill and Alex Stanton. Newcomer Luke Brett displayed the makings of a useful all-rounder and he, Alex and the Belavadi brothers should provide some experience for the 2015 side.

#### Under 10s

Doug Gordon continued to introduce the basics of cricket to a mixed group aged from 6 to 10 (one crept in under the usual age limbo bar). The option to extend the session to two hours was taken up by the majority of participants and the mix of activities continues to maintain their attention and excitement (well, mostly: fielding sitting down might actually catch on, especially at senior level ...) and their hands-on introduction to the game will be invaluable to them as they progress to competitive cricket. Luke Brett stood out in particular and was duly promoted to play with the Under 11s where he performed with great promise in the second half of the season.
